

PADRE'S CORNER

November 6, 2016

Faith involves not just a movement of the intellect and reason, but also of the heart and soul filled with receptors to the emotional impact of our deep-rooted convictions. I am with 103 pilgrims this week in Italy, experiencing all of these dimensions of our spirituality. Our experiences will be conveyed to you in a few days, upon our return to the United States on November 10. By then, America will have a new president. I pray the winning candidate will protect our country, spur onward job growth, protect religious freedoms, encourage strong family life, and be desirous of legislation to protect the unborn child. I often think of Saint Mother Teresa's comments decades ago that a country cannot expect blessings from God if it destroys the unborn child. In other words, blessings economically and protection from terrorists.

Journeying in Italy allows for the intimate exchanges of our faith with history, culture, and legacy. Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome allows us to walk the grounds of the first martyrs, including Saint Peter upon whose tomb the basilica rests. Nearby is the Coliseum, which evokes memories of the early Christians enduring pain and suffering at the hands of non-believers through their faith in Jesus. Near the Coliseum is the Roman Forum, containing the ruins of a once prosperous community where leisure and entertainment meant more than core religious values. Florence will engage us with the works of Michelangelo, such as the gracefully tall image of King David. Pompeii recalls the ruins of another affluent community, devoid of the spiritual union with God that could have saved it as a killer volcano struck. All of these encounters, plus an audience with Pope Francis, permits an engaging of the senses for interior growth.

Connectivity with our faith is often the polar opposite of our highly technological culture, which can seem remote and distant as we become more robotized as a people. Social media encourages this disconnect, as it replaces the phone calls and letters that once were part and parcel of human encounters. While recognizing its value for people separated by large distances, it has become a consistent replacement against the deeper connections that once prevailed of hanging out on a house porch or playing in a park amongst youngsters. The computerization of the masses almost looks like the zombie-like cult film of 1968 "Night of the Living Dead," with its empty faces and unmoved souls. Case in point is a recent article I read about the growing presence of tiny implants in a finger, that allows the person to avoid manual elevations of the body for such normal actions such as unlocking a door or accessing a parking gate. Called RFID (Radio Frequency Identification Technology), a tiny glass cylinder the size of a piece of rice is installed under the skin hopefully with sterilized equipment. Medical records can also be stored with the implant, plus the ability to make purchases. In my mind this not only increases the impersonalization of the culture, but the robotized furtherance that stunts and impedes human relational development. Friendship, once vivid and lovely, can also walk down this slippery slope.

I have disconnected from a few connections where this has happened, but God has provided new friendships for me that are creative and spiritually alive. This is what our faith and parish is supposed to be about. At Saint Francis of Assisi, here on Benkard Avenue, I (we) have tried to create a community setting where our connections are not mechanical but life-giving. Our main church offers lots of opportunities for prayerfulness through colorful imagery, including the meaningful statues of past saint icons (such as Therese of Lisieux, Catherine Laboure, John Vianney, and Padre Pio). The prayer garden can be accessed 24/7 every day of the week. If someone is troubled with a dilemma at three in the morning, the garden is there for them.

The four Presentation sisters occupying the convent also bring that personal touch of faith to the grounds of our parish. The catechetical program grows under the leadership of Sister Laura Urbano, who is also establishing youth groups for different age brackets. She is also helping me to offer Spanish Masses on a regular basis, to encourage our neighborhood residents to give our church a participant chance. Sister Gloria is establishing a senior group which will embrace academic, social, travel, and spiritual endeavors. The Deacon Jack Seymour Food Pantry continues to serve vast amounts of the needy, not through robots but caring human beings volunteering to bring bright lights to our troubled times. God bless us and our country. **Father Bill**
