

PADRE'S CORNER

December 25, 2016

Saint Francis of Assisi was born in the year of 1181, and died at the age of forty-five on October 3 in 1226. He was canonized a saint on July 16, 1228 by Pope Gregory IX. A spiritual crisis due to poor health, while disillusioned by the trappings of his family wealth and a militaristic world, he entered deeply into the spiritual world by founding the Franciscan order in 1210 and shortly later the Poor Clare nuns rooted in his friendship with Clare who also left the family palace. Francis was the inspiration for the San Damiano cross, after a visit to a country chapel, and the custom of the nativity crèche in 1220 in Greccio not far from Assisi. He used paintings and real live animals to convey the message about the birth of the Christ Child. Such images were important for conveying distinct religious messages to a mass of people, largely uneducated due to a lack of formal education.

During the recent early November parish trip to Italy, these finer points of his life were underscored. There was also the rich spiritual opportunity to pray at the tomb of Francis, and see the nearby incorrupt body of Clare. Francis put Jesus first in his life, which continues to be our modern challenge.

The sacrifice of Saint Francis is a perfect Christmas metaphor for our individual considerations at the end of 2016. The pilgrimage in Italy also discovered these other metaphors in the diverse journeys uncovered. In Florence, the statue of King David by Michelangelo (sculpted between 1501-1504) focused on a decision by David for the Lord that was likewise reflective of what Francis did. He struggled with personal weaknesses like we all do (impure impulses, greed, selfishness, hunger for power), but got smart in time to be repentant toward God's ways. Though David lived nearly 3000 years ago, his story resonates with our struggles today to find the divine plan in our life. Francis faced the same dilemma 800 years ago.

In Rome, after a papal audience with Pope Francis the morning the United States election results were made clear (we pray for a peaceful transition and transfer of power), there was the opportunity to discover another heroic figure who chose God first as did David with Francis and Clare. The remains of Peter, the first pope of the Church, were to be unearthed in the "Tomb of the Popes" under Saint Peter's Basilica. What an amazing visual to be face-to-face with the courageous human "rock" that Jesus built His Church upon.

Peter was also a flawed individual, and not just for denying Jesus three times. He struggled with stubbornness, impurity temptations against chastity, and stubborn eye problems in an era that lacked vision doctors. Yet God found a plan for Peter as He did David, Francis and Clare. The hope we can decipher from these true biblical stories is that the faith lessons also apply to each of us. We have the same faith as did precious generations of like-minded individuals, whether it be the courageous Christians preserving their beliefs in the Catacombs by fleeing enemies trying to destroy God's message or the architects of engineering miracles (church built in the face of the ruined pagan Pompeii destroyed by Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD, or the majestic churches somehow constructed on the soaring cliffs of the Amalfi Coast near Sorrento). If the message of God can remain constant and undiluted amongst the centuries, despite these imperfect human beings like we all are, then hopeful individual transformation is a quite real concept for each of us to embrace.

Christmas allows us to focus on what is essential in life, while remembering and thanking previous generations of parishioners that have lined the pews of our beautiful church since 1913 (not forgetting the Deacon Jack Seymour Food Pantry, which served as the original church and school with its inception in 1909). There is a thoughtful saying about Christmas from the website "Sun Gazing". The words read and ponder: "As we grow older our Christmas list gets smaller, and we find out that the things we really want can't be bought." We are all looking deeply and interiorally for the gifts of heaven that money and possessions cannot buy. We all want peace, harmony, integration, strong life purpose, and the presence of a precious few that really love us and care that we exist. That relentless search never completely ends. But, the Infant Saviour points to us the concrete

way to satisfy that search. Merry Christmas!
