

#### PADRE'S CORNER

#### **January 22, 2017**

Advice columns offer words of consolation for the wide scope of human frailties and dilemmas that we all face. I recently noticed one by a middle-aged single man, whose parents and siblings have died in recent years. A house filled with memories and possessions must now be sold. He lamented: "When I sell this place, I know I'm going to be devastated. I have been suffering with depression for more than 20 years, but now I seem to have hit bottom. My business is failing. I have a couple of friends, but they have their own families and problems. This is affecting my physical and mental health. How can I get past it? I'm not a religious person." I am left to question whether this hurting soul is open to spiritual integration.

As a contrast, yielding a possibility of such openness, is this observation from movie director Pedro Almodovar who recently released "Julieta" in his native Spain. Despite a family of practicing Catholics, "I'm not a believer. I didn't have faith. Faith is a gift and I didn't receive it, and I am very sorry because I miss it. The way the Spanish people practice Catholicism is something that I like, it is a real support for them." The drama of life is vividly found in the books we read, offering a verbal solace that becomes fuller and richer within the lens of faith. Anne Morrow Lindbergh was the wife of the famous aviator Charles. In 1955, she authored "Gift From the Sea." In a state of solitude, she echoed "The world today does not understand, in either man or woman, the need to be alone."

During the November excursion to Italy, such aspiration for alone solitude was reflected in a touching visual print purchased alongside the piercing Amalfi Coast. A monk looks at the visual beauty God created with the coastline, and leaning against a tree seated meditates and prays about what he observes. The sketch bridges faith and human questioning about life issues. Forty years after the Lindbergh essay, in 1995, author Azar Nafisi of Iran wrote "Reading Lolita in Tehran." On the need for positivity, as we individually endure the battles of existence, she explained: "In all great works of fiction, regardless of the grim reality they present, there is an affirmation of life against the transience of that life, an essential defiance...An act of insubordination against the betrayals, horrors and infidelities of life"

The need to be optimistic, despite a media and culture that salivates for the sordid and negative, was addressed on December 4 by Pope Francis during his Sunday prayer reflection of the Angelus at Saint Peter's Square in Rome. "The communications media have a very great responsibility. Nowadays they have in their hands the possibility and the capacity to form opinion: they can form a good or a bad opinion...They can be tempted by calumny, and therefore used to slander, to sully people, especially in the world of politics. They can be used as a means of defamation. There is no right to this. This is a sin and it is harmful...Mental pollution...Today there is a need for a revolution of tenderness in this world that suffers from cardio sclerosis (hardening of the heart)."

As an interesting aside, the creation of Christmas cards flowed from this spiritual desire to "accentuate the positive" ("Mary Poppins") in the midst of the dilemmas faced. Sir Henry Cole, born in the Victorian period of 1808 England, is considered to be the lightning rod of the greeting card industry in the complex financial and warfare times of the early 1800's on the worldwide stage. Influencing the postal system, plus training schools of music and cooking in London, Cole also penned books of inspiration for children. In 1843 he contracted with painter J.C. Horsley to create the first Christmas greeting card envisioning themes of faith, health, family togetherness, and ministering to the poor through feeding and clothing. Americans imported such cards until 1875 in Boston, when Prussia immigrant Louis Prang brought that idea of hope to our shores. The dramatic expansion of the card industry was ushered forward in 1915 by the Hall brothers of Kansas City, Missouri (later called Hallmark).

By the grace of God we can all bring sparks of hope, goodness, and faith in our darkened world. If the advice columns, movies, books, and greeting card industries can inspire from remote settings of orientation then we individually can certainly do it one at a time.
