

#### Padre's Corner

### May 7, 2017 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Saint Cyprian (200-258 AD) was a devout writer of the faith in Carthage, North Africa. A convert at age thirty-five, after a "dissipated youth," he was martyred under the decadent Emperor Valerian. He once wrote this eye-opening spiritual insight: "When I was still lying in darkness and gloomy night, I used to regard it as extremely difficult and demanding to do what God's mercy was suggesting to me. I myself was held in bonds by the innumerable errors of my previous life, from which I did not believe I could possibly be delivered, so I was disposed to acquiesce in my clinging vices and to indulge my sins. But after that, by the help of the water of new birth, the stain of my former life was washed away, and a light from above, serene and pure, was infused into my reconciled heart a second birth restored me to a new man. Then, in a wondrous manner every doubt began to fade. I clearly understood that what had first lived within me, enslaved by the vices of the flesh, was earthly and that what, instead, the Holy Spirit had wrought within me was divine and heavenly." Baptism restores us.

Life has a way of reminding us of our mortality, within the wider lens of perceiving a heaven or eternity that awaits us. While we have every responsibility to enjoy each day of life that God grants to us, like a woodpecker or termite attacking a wooden base we realize that the passage of time moves each of us ever so closer to that ultimate departure from planet earth. When I recently saw the "Association," a popular 1960's musical group (Windy, Never My Love, Along Comes Mary, Cherish), at a concert hall in Peekskill, the aging process was abundantly evident. Meeting the original members afterwards, fifty years after they began, was a vivid reminder that we may always be young of heart but not young of body.

Mayor Judy Kennedy, City of Newburgh, was recently diagnosed with ovarian cancer. "I think this cancer is definitely a teacher. I've always looked at most of the hardships in my life - and I've gone through two or three catalysts of real life-changing events - each that have propelled me forward as a better person. But each has required the walk through the dark night of the soul first." Saints like John of the Cross and Therese of Lisieux also defined their human struggles as a "dark night of the soul." John Constable, the artist of Suffolk in England, lived from 1776-1837. His paintings would touch the stark realities of the Industrial Revolution, pitting serene country sides versus smoky utterances from factory buildings. The death of his wife Maria, in 1828, thrust him into the tentacles of despair. Anglican Bishop John Fisher, a friend of Constable, inspired him to wed that searing grief to the painter's landscape of faith. Thus emerged, in 1831, "Salisbury Cathedral From The Meadows." The depictions of a bursting sky of dark clouds, a lonely lost dog, crumbling bridge, and swallows searching for a passage of light beckon thoughts of seeking God to lessen the burdens of life while offering hope.

Art historian Mary Tompkins Lewis teaches at Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut. About this stirring painting, she reflected: "the painting may also chart a personal passage out of the grief that had lately consumed the artist. The arc of his rainbow, which stretches protectively over the cathedral, terminates exactly, and surely not by chance, in the archdeacon's residence on the cathedral close. Constable's compelling reworking of this familiar subject makes the painting a poignant tribute to friendship, to hope and to the enduring power of nature that sustained him." We apply our own struggles of loneliness, discouragement, fear, loss, and indecision within the frame of this painted reflection on life and faith. Saint Cyprian concludes: "We ought never to forget, beloved, that we have renounced the world. We are living here now as aliens and only for a time. When the day of our homecoming puts an end to our exile, frees us from the bonds of the world, and restores us to paradise and to a kingdom, we should welcome it... O, the delight of that heavenly kingdom where there is no fear of death! O, the supreme and endless bliss of everlasting life!"

My vocation as a priest is to help prepare you for heaven. Your job is to remind that this exit awaits me also. God bless our souls.

### 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima

On May 13th, 1917, a beautiful woman in white, more brilliant than the sun, appeared to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima, Portugal. She appeared six times to Lucia (9) and her cousins Francisco (8) and Jacinta (6) between May 13th and October 13, 1917.

Our Lady of Fatima told the children......

"To pray and say the Rosary every day,
To bring Peace to the World"

At the last apparition (Oct. 13, 19170) over 70,000 people witnessed, "the sun circling three times." In 1930, the Bishop had approved the apparition as authentic. Since 1930 millions of people from all over the world have traveled to Fatima to pray to Our Lady.

With great authority, Peter proclaims to the people that the Christ who was crucified is indeed the Messiah. Urging them to reform and be baptized in the name of Christ, three thousand responded to his words and were baptized.

#### Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:20b-25

This is a strong exhortation from Peter to the people to endure suffering for Christ as he did for them. Healed by his wounds, they have "returned to the shepherd."

#### Gospel: John 10:1-10

Christ uses the beautiful image of the shepherd to describe his care for his sheep. He also says he is the sheepgate and promises that "Whoever enters through me will be safe."
