The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ
(Corpus Christi Sunday)

Saint Augustine wrote 1600 years ago: "The world is a book and those who do not travel read only one page." 1400 years later novelist Mark Twain continued the same stream of thought with these words: "Travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness, and many of our people need it sorely on these accounts. Broad, wholesome, charitable views of men and things cannot be acquired by vegetating in one little corner of the earth all one's lifetime."

Not all priests like to travel the way I do. We basically use our personal vacation time to do so, which could largely explain their perspective. In fairness, such spiritual journeys are not purely fun and relaxation. There are the responsibilities of being the group chaplain, early wake up calls, dealing with complaints, crowds, and other human factors that can be unpleasant at times. Alternatively there is the wider scope of memories, experiences, growing in the faith, and rich new friendships that can possibly emerge. This is why I choose to lead them, and sometimes going a second or even third time so my new flock in Newburgh can learn and explore as I have done.

The recent sojourn to Europe from April 24 through May 4 was such a privilege. Fatima, Portugal was a sacred stop with the May 13th apparition anniversary of one century ago in the midst of World War I fast approaching. Our group of forty-four had the privilege of meeting the one surviving family member of the three Fatima children, Marie the niece of Lucia. Now 96 years young, she is the final human link to that iconic moment in Church history though certainly the spiritual growths continue. We also went to Lourdes, France to be part of a special moment from 160 years ago when Saint Bernadette saw the Virgin Mary near a cave (with messages of hope and conversion as the Fatima children would receive from Her 60 years later). Majestic Spain was also embraced with Madrid (saw flamenco dancing), Avila (the holy spot where Saint Theresa lived five centuries ago, later to become a doctor of the Church through her "Interior Castle" writings), Montserrat with the "Black Madonna" image, and Barcelona (Mass at a cathedral built 1100 years ago).

The traveling spirit will continue this year **December 4-14** when we examine a very different part of Europe: the Alpine region "Christmas Adventure Featuring Europe's Famous Christkindl Markets." In Germany we will see Frankfurt including a cruise on the Rhine River, the Heidelberg Castle, Oberammergau famous for the local citizens Passion Play, Neuschwanstein Castle which served as the inspiration for the castle at Disneyland in California, Rothenburg which maintains its medieval time charms, and Munich for the famed Christmas shopping markets. In Switzerland we tour Basel, the medieval walls plus waterfront of Lucerne, the Alpine mountain peaks of Eiger and Jungfrau, and the shores of Lake Zurich. We also venture to the mountainous zones of Austria with Innsbruck in the heart of the Alps, Salzburg famous for the "Sound of Music" story with the Von Trapp family (several of whom I had correspondence with two decades ago) popularized by Julie Andrews in the 1965 Hollywood film rendering, and among other stops to Rathaus where the musical genius Mozart was born.

Daily Masses at historical spots will be integral to this pilgrimage. I hope you will consider joining us on this inspirational journey, and/or as well the planned visit to the Holy Land the second week of January in 2018. More on Israel in the near future. Please contact the rectory soon for a pamphlet and reservation form. Actor Danny Kaye (1911-1987), famous for his role in "Hans Christian Anderson" from 1952, reflected: "To travel is to take a journey into yourself." THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST
(CORPUS CHRISTI)

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Moses reminds the Israelites that when they were starving in the desert, the Lord fed them with "manna" -- a food not known to them.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul points out to the Corinthians that through the sharing of the cup and the breaking of the bread, they are all one in Christ Jesus.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

After Jesus feeds the five thousand people with barley loaves and fishes, he tries to make them understand the significance and the meaning of what he has done. He tells them, in mysterious and beautiful words, that the bread he gives is his flesh and says, "I myself am the living bread... If anyone eats this bread, he shall live forever."

In your goodness please bring **PANCAKE MIX & SYRUP** to Church next weekend to be distributed to the less fortunate in our area thru our Food Pantry.




